#### FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR MOIRA

Dear CPC Family:

A devout Christian recently asked, me, very earnestly, "Why do we celebrate Advent?" "Hasn't Jesus been born already?"



At the beginning of my Christian life, I thought of Advent as an inconvenience, a four-week encumbrance to the fun and joy of Christmas, with all my family gathered around the tree, covered with lights and decorations, with stuffed stockings and presents scatted about, the aromas of delicious home-made concoctions waffling through the house, and Christmas carols blaring on the stereo tucked away in a corner. I have changed over the years. While I still love the feeling of Christmas morning with my family, I have learned to treasure the wisdom of the four weeks of Advent (orthodox Christians observe 40 days), our season of waiting, longing, and preparation for Christmas.

Especially as Christmas preparation has more and more been given over to "consumerism," it is refreshing to return to the rituals of Advent: lighting the Advent wreath and meditating on the scriptures. Slowing down and finding peace in a season that wants us to speed up. Finding ways to give instead of "making that list and checking it twice." Singing and rediscovering Advent hymns and the Christmas Carols. Putting out a nativity scene or making a Jesse tree – a tree decorated with symbols from the Bible that point to Jesus. Advent invites us to find our unique way to keep Jesus the center of Christmas celebration.

There are other ways we are preparing this Advent at CPC:

- Plan to be at worship all Advent Sundays for the lighting of the Advent Wreath.
- Buy a Chocolate Advent Calendar (\$4, all proceeds go to the church) and reflect on the Advent verses while enjoying a daily dose of chocolate!
- Join the Advent Conspiracy!. Spend less, give more, worship fully, love all. Find out more about it here: https://adventconspiracy.org/
- Participate in greening the sanctuary, December 7 beginning at 10am. Don't forget to dedicate a poinsettia (\$14) while you're at it!
- Contribute to the Christmas Joy Offering by December 8.
- Continue to decorate the "Mitten Tree" to keep chilly hands warm this winter. Gently worn coats are still gladly being accepted as well.
- Attend the Children's Christmas Play at 5:00pm on Dec. 8, followed by the Vespers Dinner at 5:30pm. Bring a gift for a child from the Freeport pantry (until Dec. 15).
- Enjoy the Women's Noel Luncheon on Dec. 14 @1pm, details enclosed.
- Need a Christmas carol fix? Go Caroling on Dec. 17.
- Attend Candlelight Christmas Eve's Service of Lessons and Carols, Dec. 24, at 7pm.
- Continue the Christmas spirit at the Carol-Sing Service on Sunday Dec. 29 at 9am.

Discover what works for you and prepare earnestly this season. Together, let us travel through Advent, in prayer and song, good deeds, joyful fellowship, raising our voices and proclaiming: **O Come, O Come, Emanuel**!

## OF THE FREEPORT EMERGENCY FOOD PANTRY

Our Toy Drive for the Pantry is in full swing!!! Now through Decem-

ber 15 we will be collecting toys for Christmas for the children who utilize the Freeport Food Pantry!

Our deacons have 'adopted' 11 families from the Freeport Emergency Food Pantry this year for our toy drive. Instead of us buying random toys, we've been given the sex and age of the children in each family and in many cases, their 'interests'. This will allow us to purchase more 'personal' Christmas gifts for each child.

The family toy list is displayed on a table in Grafing Hall. Please look the list over and put your name down next to one or more children. You will then be responsible for purchasing a gift for that child. (The Deacons are asking that you do not spend more than \$50 on your gift in order not to have large 'monetary' swing gaps for children of the same family.)

When you purchase a gift, you MUST somehow attach the child's name to the gift so we know which family and which child that present was intended for. (Scotch-taping or pinning the handwritten name to each gift would be fine.)

You do not have to stick to one family and you do not have to purchase gifts for an entire family. You may randomly select any child(ren) from any of the families.

Please bring the unwrapped toy(s) to church by Dec. 15. (You may bring your gifts to the Vespers Dinner on Dec. 8 if you like, but the drive will not end until Dec. 15). We'll bring the toys over to the Pantry shortly thereafter.

This is a different type of 'Toy Drive' for us this year, and we hope it will be successful. If anyone

The <u>SEASON OF</u> <u>ADVENT</u> begins on <u>Dec. 1</u> with the lighting of the Hope candle. The Peace candle will be lit on Dec. 8,



the Joy candle on Dec. 15, the Love candle on Dec. 22. The Christ candle, which is actually NOT part of our Advent candle set, will be lit at our Christmas Eve candlelight service with Lessons and Carols at 7pm.

"Advent" means "coming" or "arrival." During the season of Advent, we celebrate Christ's coming into the world and watch with expectant hope for his coming again. In its historical origins, the season of Advent was patterned after the season of Lent, a six-week period of penitence and preparation for Easter. Similarly, the four weeks of Advent present an opportunity for communal discernment and personal examination, as the church prepares to celebrate the Nativity of the Lord and looks with hope for Christ's return.

An excerpt from the Companion to the Book of Common Worship (Geneva Press, 2003, 96)

In Advent we expectantly wait for the One who has already come. We anticipate the promised justice of God's new world, yet we praise God who raised the "righteous branch" to rule with justice and righteousness. We hope for the restoration of the afflicted, the tormented, and the grieving, yet we delight that healing has come in Christ. We long for the beating of swords into plowshares, yet we rejoice that the Prince of Peace has appeared. We yearn for the barren deserts of our inner cities to flourish, yet we laud the desert Rose that has bloomed. We dream of the land where lions and lambs live in harmony, yet we acclaim the child born to lead us into the promised land. Christ has come! Christ is risen! Christ will come again! In Advent, we are living between

the first and the second coming of the Lord. The dialectical tension of maranatha [alternately translated "Come, our Lord!" or "Our Lord has come"] — placing us between memory and hope, past and future — may strengthen our Advent liturgies. Perhaps we need to cling to the ancient cry of *maranatha*! and its paradoxical meanings so we may freely embrace "the new thing" prophesied by Isaiah (Isaiah 43:19) that God is doing among us right now. The tension and paradox we find in Advent shapes our celebrations during the season."

In the lead up to Christmas, many of us spend



time in search of the 'perfect gift', the gift that communicates to friends and family how much we know and love them. Jesus came to live among us, bringing light into darkness, and reconciliation to God

and to one another. A perfect gift from a gracious God. As important as gifts to loved ones are, the Presbyterian Church (USA) gives throughout the year through the Christmas Joy Offering, drawing us back to the manger and God's perfect gift to us.

During this Advent Season, we celebrate leadership; past, present and future through support of the Christmas Joy Offering. We do so because church leaders greatly impact our lives of faith, walking with us down the past to be more like Jesus. We want future leaders for the church and world, like those educated at our Presbyterian-related schools and colleges equipping communities of color to reflect the

wideness of God's intended diversity, and we want those church leaders and their families who find themselves grappling with a critical financial need to have the resources they need. For those supported through the Christmas Joy Offering, this help is truly a gift from above. May our gifts, and the leaders who receive them, point us always to the truth of the one whose birth we celebrate, Jesus Christ - the truly perfect gift.

The Christmas Joy Offering will be collected during worship service on <u>Dec 8</u>. Envelopes can be found in this Tower Chimes, in the Sanctuary on the 8th or on the back table in the Sanctuary throughout the month of December.
