

WHERE, O WHERE, IS THE FREEPORT EMERGENCY FOOD PANTRY?

As mentioned in last month's Tower Chimes, the Freeport Emergency Food Pantry has moved to 230 Hanse Ave. in South Freeport. However, finding the Pantry is not so easy as it is now in an industrial area and the buildings are not well-marked, if at all!

Below are more precise written directions to help us find the Pantry:

Start out on Merrick Road heading west.

Cross over the Meadowbrook Parkway bridge. At the intersection light, bear left onto Mill Road, which is the road BJ's is on.

Hanse Avenue will be the second street on your left.

Make a left on Hanse Avenue and head south until you see a sign for #210 Hanse, which is a company called AHRC.

Pass #210 Hanse and then

make a right behind that warehouse.

The road then bears left, and the

FIRST DOOR ON THE LEFT BEHIND THE WAREHOUSE IS THE PANTRY, #230.

The door is not marked. Hopefully signs will be up shortly!



NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER –

This year's National Day of Prayer will fall on May 4, 2017, but was recognized by CPC *on Sunday, April 30* with handouts supplied by Joe Schuessler and special prayers and scripture by Rev. Ralph Wright.

The mission of the National Day of Prayer Task Force is to mobilize prayer in America and to encourage personal repentance and righteousness in the culture.

The National Day of Prayer is an annual observance held on the first Thursday of May, inviting people of all faiths to pray for the nation. It was created in 1952 by a joint resolution of the United States Congress, and signed into law by President Harry S. Truman. Their Task Force is a privately-funded organization whose purpose is to encourage participation on the National Day of Prayer. It exists to communicate with every individual the need for personal repentance and prayer, to create appropriate materials, and to mobilize the Christian community to intercede for America's leaders and its families. The Task Force represents a Judeo-Christian expression of the national observance, based on the understanding that this country was birthed in prayer and in reverence for the God of the Bible.

The National Day of Prayer has great significance for us as a nation as it enables us to recall and to teach the way in which our founding fathers sought the wisdom of God when faced with critical decisions. It stands as a call for us to humbly come before God, seeking His guidance for our leaders and His grace upon us as a people. The unanimous passage of the bill establishing the National Day of Prayer as an annual event, signifies that prayer is as important to our nation today as it was in the beginning.

Thank you, Joe, for helping us remember!
