FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR MOIRA

"Oh give thanks to the LORD, call upon His name; Make known His deeds among the peoples" 1 Chronicles 16:8 Dear CPC Friends.

One of my most memorable Thanksgiving dinners took place in a dingy church basement. It was the day before Thanksgiving, and not a soul was still. We were chopping collard greens, peeling potatoes, re-stocking the pantry, setting the tables. There were about 40 of us. Some members of the group were youth and their pastor from an upstate church. The rest of the group were recovering addicts and alcoholics who were struggling to stay clean during the stress



of the holiday. I was an associate pastor, directing this recovery program and other services to the poor and homeless. We were preparing a grand meal for the homeless on Thanksgiving Day. But that day, the day before Thanksgiving, was for us. Before we plowed into our delicious meal of turkey and fixings, we formed a gratitude circle.

One by one, members of the recovery program spoke. Someone was grateful that they were alive, sitting in that circle and not out in the cold. Another person was grateful that she no longer sold her body for crack. Someone was clean and sober for three days, and grateful for the hot meal waiting. Someone, who had no family, was grateful for the family sitting around that circle, a family that God provided. An HIV positive woman gave thanks for finally having a room she could call her own. Nearly everyone spoke of their gratitude to God, for not giving up on them, despite committing actions that were despicable, ungodly, criminal. They thanked God for the church providing them a place to get better, and for the kids who came to be with them. One recovery leader spoke of us needing to pray constantly for "gratitude in attitude." With gratitude we get better. We can heal. We stay connected to our divine source. Without gratitude our spirits shrivel, and our souls become as hard as a pit.

The teenagers were for once, silent. They took it all in. They spoke humbly of their gratitude to these men and women who shared their lives so generously and honestly with them. They realized how much they took for granted. They were grateful to be part of a bigger story of grace. We then joined hands and prayed for each other and other sick and suffering people. We prayed for gratitude.

IT IS THANKFUL PEOPLE WHO ARE

IS NOT HAPPY

As we prepare to celebrate Thanksgiving, remember we are part of a gratitude circle. Everyday practice giving thanks. During my recent trip to Mexico giving thanks was a daily discipline. Give thanks for being alive. Give thanks for each person around you. Give thanks for the food you have to eat. Give thanks for the shower you were able to take. For the breath you just took. Give thanks for Jesus, who reminds us every day of the Father's unconditional love. Remember what Meister Eckhart, a German theologian, once said: "If the only prayer you

said in your whole life was, "thank you," that would suffice." So, let us give thanks at the Harvest Festival, and at the Thank-Living celebration, and the ability to help those with less than we have. Let us give thanks for God's Spirit which fills our church, and for all the opportunities we have to give back to God for what we have received.

<u>Volunteer Opportunities at the</u> <u>Freeport Soup Kitchen</u>

I recently began volunteering at the Freeport Soup Kitchen. Formerly associated with The INN, it is now on its own, operating under the name of "Soup to Nuts." The kitchen serves a healthy meal each weekday at noon to as many as 100 people on a given day. Individuals volunteer for particular days to help prepare meals sourced from donations from various businesses and groups. Some churches, including our sister Freeport church, provide meals on selected days.

I'm not suggesting we abandon our support to the Freeport Food Pantry. I have also been volunteering at the pantry, and the need is always there. But I'm suggesting that we can also help the kitchen as they try to address the nutritional needs of the community. So I'm challenging you to:

- Consider devoting one morning a week to the kitchen (3 – 4 hours) to assist in preparing the daily meal, or, better yet;
- Gathering together to provide on a consistent once-a-week basis, a simple main course to be

served. This would be a great outreach opportunity for our congregation. With the assistance of the Deacons, this weekly meal could be prepared and delivered to the kitchen one weekday morning for serving that same day.

The kitchen is housed in the basement of the Christ Lutheran Church at 61 N. Grove Street in Freeport. It's just north of Sunrise Highway. It's also just 2 miles west of our church. Sadly, it's hard to think that such need is right on our doorstep. Could we help? November 1 is All Saint's Day!

In early Christian tradition, saints' days began as a way to mark the anniversary of a martyr's death — his or her "birthday" as a saint. By the middle of the church's first millennium,

there were so many martyrs (particularly due to the persecution of Diocletian) that it was hard to give them all their due. All Saints' Day was established as an opportunity to honor all the saints, known and unknown.

All Saints' Day has a rather different focus in the Reformed tradition. While we may give thanks for the lives of particular luminaries of ages past, the emphasis is on the ongoing sanctification of the *whole* people of God. Rather than putting saints on pedestals as holy people set apart in glory, we give glory to God for the ordinary, holy lives of the believers in this and every age. This is an appropriate time to give thanks to members of the community of faith who have died in the past year. We also pray that we may be counted among the company of the faithful in God's eternal realm.

Let's take a moment to remember those in our lives who have passed this past year.

CHRISTMAS TOY DRIVE FOR THE FAMILIES



OF THE FREEPORT EMERGENCY FOOD PANTRY

From November 17 through December 15 we will be collecting

toys for Christmas for the children who utilize the Freeport Food Pantry!

Our deacons will be 'adopting' families from the Freeport Emergency Food Pantry this year for our toy drive. Instead of us buying random toys, we'll be given the sex and age of the children in each family and hopefully their 'interests'. This will allow us to purchase more 'personal' Christmas gifts for each child. Depending on how many children and toys are requested, we may end up 'adopting' several families.

Once the Pantry gives our deacons the family lists, hopefully by November 15, we will display them on the table in the back of Grafing Hall. If you'd like to participate in this toy drive, we will need you to <u>put your name down next to one or more of the 'children' of a family (or different families)</u>. You will then be responsible for purchasing a gift for that child.

Each family will have a letter to identify them and then a # to identify each child in that family. For example, family "A" has four children, so their children would be separately identified as A1, A2, A3 and A4; Family "B" has two children, so those children would be identified as B1 and B2.

When you purchase a gift, you MUST somehow attach an ID# to that gift so we know which family and which child that gift was intended for. (Scotchtaping or pinning a handwritten identification number to each gift would be fine.)

You do not have to stick to one family and you do not have to purchase gifts for an entire family. You may randomly select any child(ren) from any of the families.

Please bring the unwrapped toy(s) to church by Dec. 15. (You may bring your gifts to the Vespers Dinner on Dec. 8 if you like, but the drive will not end until Dec. 15..) We'll bring the toys over to the Pantry shortly thereafter.

This is a different type of 'Toy Drive' for us this year, and we hope it will be successful. If anyone has any questions or suggestions, please speak with one of our deacons, Jessie, Mona, Rich, Mary, Diane and Bobbie.

CHRIST THE KING / REIGN OF CHRIST Sunday, November 24

The festival of Christ the King (or Reign of Christ) ends our marking of Ordinary Time after the Day of Pentecost, and moves us to the threshold of Advent, the season of hope for Christ's coming again at the end of time.

The day centers on the crucified and risen Christ, whom God exalted to rule over the whole universe. The celebration of the lordship of Christ thus looks back to Ascension, Easter, and Transfiguration, and points ahead to the appearing in glory of the King of kings and Lord of lords. Christ reigns supreme. Christ's truth judges falsehood. As the Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end, Christ is the center of the universe, the ruler of all history, the judge of all people. In Christ all things began, and in Christ all things will be fulfilled. In the end, Christ will triumph over the forces of evil.

Such concepts as these cluster around the affirmation that Christ is King or Christ reigns! As sovereign ruler, Christ calls us to a loyalty that transcends every earthly claim on the human heart. To Christ alone belongs the supreme allegiance in our lives. Christ calls us to stand with those who in every age confessed, "Jesus Christ is Lord!" In every generation, demagogues emerge to claim an allegiance that belongs only to God. But Christ alone has the right to claim our highest loyalty. The blood of martyrs, past and present, witnesses to this truth.
