From the Desk of Pastor Moira Ahearne

"I perceived that there is nothing better for them than to be joyful and to do good as long as they live; also that everyone should eat and drink and take pleasure in all his toil—this is God's gift to humankind." Eccl. 3:12-13

Dear CPC Family;

For the past month, the "Back to School" commercials on TV and advertisements have been vying for our attention since the end of July. American families across the country on average will spend \$600 on school supplies, clothes, and electronics to make sure the little ones are well-stocked and spiffy as they cross the thresholds of learning.

I find it interesting that this significant investment in school supplies and getting ready for school falls in the "Happiness Happens" month - August. The Secret Society of Happy People lists 31 characteristics of happiness. The Secret Society of Happy People believes happiness can be contagious. They want to spread happiness, and they believe each of us can make our communities more positive. Even schools. Even churches. (Look over the list of 31 traits that promote happiness below -- in case you can't read the captions).

Now there's no reason we can't make September <u>OUR</u> "Happiness Happens" month. Each of us can surely relate to some of these traits. We can pick one a day and prepare ourselves for the new school year and the new church season.

Imagine how different we would be if our "back to school" list contained the mandate to cultivate these traits in preparation for learning. How different school would be! What if we also understood these traits as essential ingredients towards being an alive, healthy church, open to the Holy Spirit, ready to embrace growth? 
